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Administration Information for Parents

Cyber Wellness Issues Needing Parents' Attention

On a few occasions, we have received feedback that some of our pupils had carried out unnecessary video-taping of their school mates without permission and circulating the videos on social media to other school mates. Some pupils had also formed Whatsapp chat groups and are active on Facebook. While we acknowledge that curiosity and experimentation may be fuelling their on-line interaction, we appeal to parents to work with us to monitor their children's use of social media and to guide them carefully in the proper use of technology so that they will not bring harm to themselves or others.

Good Behaviour on Public Buses

The school seeks parents' support to help our pupils to be responsible users of public transport who show respect to other commuters on public buses. It is important that all our pupils follow the following guidelines while commuting on public buses:

- Respect self and others
- Be safe and responsible

For safety reason, they are strongly encouraged to remain seated at all times whenever seats are available. Loud noises and acts (e.g. walking along the aisle and playing in the bus) that may distract the driver or disturb other commuters are strictly not allowed. Pupils are also expected not to eat or drink on public buses to avoid dirtying the bus and causing inconvenience to other commuters.

Update on Primary Education Review and Implementation (PERI) Facilities Upgrading

We are in the final stages of our PERI Upgrading and expect works to be completed by the end of Term 4. So far, the contractor is largely on schedule. Progressively, we have started using new facilities (e.g. Learning and Behavioural Support and the Programme for Active Learning Rooms) as the contractor hands them over to us.

We recently also received good news that funding has been approved for a slab-over project over the rear sloped area leading to the PUB canal. This will create more playing and facilities space at the same level as our rear backyard space now. The project is now in the planning, finalisation and approval of design stage. We look forward excitedly to having this extra playing space for our pupils.

External Safety Validation (ESV)

On 20 Jul 2017, an external safety validation team came and reviewed our safety and security processes and efforts. This team with their specific expertise and knowledge, provided us the benefit of fresh perspectives and helped ensure that we did not have any safety or security blind spots. The ESV, further contributed to the safety and well-being of our pupils and staff.

Improvement to School Uniform

Based on our review, we have made some modifications to the boy's uniform shirt and the unisex school PE/CCA T-shirt. The girl's pinafore and blouse remain the same. The 2018 Primary 1 cohort will be the first level wide group to use it.

1. The new boy's shirt is designed to not be tucked-in and comes with a 4 cm band at the bottom, with two fastening buttons on the sides of the band.
2. The new PE/CCA T-shirt comes with solid colour sleeves and a broad shoulder strip to the collar in the colour of the respective sports houses. The sides on the front also has a broader vertical house coloured strip.

Do note that even though the stocks are already available, the 2017 Primary 1 to 6 pupils can continue to use the older version of both the boy's shirt and the unisex T-shirt until they graduate or when replacements are needed.

Curricular Innovation

P3 Sail-Boat Making	Pupils had to design and build a boat using recycled materials that is able to move on water without sinking. They applied concepts they have learnt in the chapter 'Materials' to decide on the materials to use for the different parts of their boat.
P4 Fun with Shadows	Pupils attended an activity on the topic of "Light" at the Singapore Science Centre where they learned to create cut-outs to make silhouettes of plants and animals. They were taught how to use LED lights to bring out stories using their silhouettes and to create a mood on the screen. Following this activity, the pupils composed and presented their own stories at school using shadow play to demonstrate their creativity and their understanding of the concepts on light.

P5 Pass it On Activity on Heredity	Pupils constructed a family tree using recycled materials to trace the characteristics that are passed down from their grandparents to them. They then carried out a presentation on their family tree to their peers to share on the various characteristics they have inherited and to appreciate the diversity of characteristics that they possess.
P2 Fun with Maths	Pupils used the concepts and skills learnt from the topic of Money to play various roles as the cashier and customers in a shop. They had a lot of fun deciding on what to buy and how to use the “cash” to pay for their purchases.
P4 Fun with Maths	Based on the topics of Decimals and Fractions, pupils made cup-cakes and applied their knowledge of fractions, mixed numbers and decimals when they measured the ingredients to roll out their cupcakes. In teams, they had great fun preparing and savouring their cupcakes.
Mother Tongue Language Fortnight	Held in in Term 3, Week 3 and 4, a wide range of activities related to Chinese, Malay, and Tamil languages were conducted to help our pupils build a deep interest in language-learning and to gain insights into the associated culture. The CL pupils enjoyed activities like Chinese Tea Appreciation, Chinese painting, story-telling, paper-cutting, cross-talk and language games. The ML pupils took part in traditional games like congkak, capteh and bola lubang. They also attended workshops on Batik Painting, Angklung, Dikir Barat and Seni Khat. The TL pupils took part in activities like Lamp designing, Clay Craft, Henna Painting, Kolam, Traditional Indian Games, Language Games, Story-Telling and Drama.

Singapore Teaching Practice (STP)	<p>Launched by our Director-General of Education at NIE's Redesigning Pedagogy International Conference on 31 May 2017, the Singapore Teaching Practice (STP) is a model that makes explicit how effective teaching and learning is achieved in Singapore schools. Anchored on the notion that teaching is a profession, the STP draws on Singapore educators' beliefs about how students learn and teachers teach. Our school leaders, selected key personnel and teacher leaders have undergone training on STP. We will cascade the training to all our teachers at our year-end review and planning week so that all of us are equipped with the necessary knowledge and competencies on STP to deliver engaging and efficacious lessons.</p>
