<p>Updates on Primary Education Review and Implementation (PERI) Upgrading</p>	<p>The upgrading works in the classrooms have been completed. What remains is the completion of the two-storey extension building and some common use facilities like the Media Resource Library, Staff Rooms and special purpose rooms.</p>
<p>Emergency Phone Message Relay / Contact Tracing Exercise</p>	<p>ZPS conducts this exercise annually to update and test out the effectiveness of our system. On the morning of Saturday, 11 February 2017, the exercise was activated at 11.00 am by our Principal. Staff were contacted through the established chain and the system was found to be expedient and effective in contacting staff in times of emergencies. A similar exercise and contact details check will be conducted for pupils in Term 2.</p>
<p>Fire and Evacuation Exercise 1 / 2017</p>	<p>As part of emergency preparedness, all schools are required to conduct two emergency evacuation exercises each year. Our school evacuation plans were adjusted/refined and briefed to staff and students before we conducted the 1/2017 exercise on 17 February 2017 (Total Defence Day). Our staff and students responded swiftly and appropriately to make the exercise a success.</p>
<p>Revised System to Confirm with Parents/Guardians about Pupils' Absence from School</p>	<p>With effect from Term 2, if a pupil is absent on a given day, an SMS will be sent out by our General Office (GO) staff by 9.45 am, to notify parents of the pupil's absence. Parents are requested to update GO (Tel: 6283 5413) on the reason for the child's absence and provide a letter of explanation and/or a medical certificate when the pupil returns to school. If a pupil is in school, but for some reason(s) the pupil's presence was not captured and the SMS is sent out to parents, please notify GO immediately and we will immediately verify and confirm the pupils' status.</p>
<p>Annual School-Based Health Screening In Primary Schools for all Pupils</p>	<p>The School Health Service will be visiting our school to conduct the Annual Health Screening for all our pupils from Thursday 11 May 2017 to Mon 22 May 2017. Form teachers will be collecting health booklets and immunization certificates from the pupils of P1 and P5 during the first week of May 2016. All international students must bring copies of their immunization certificates from their home countries. Pupils who have lost their health booklet or those who do not have one can purchase a copy from our school bookshop @\$1.50 each.</p>
<p>School Breakfast and Lunch Scheme for FAS pupils</p>	<p>FAS pupils are provided with complimentary breakfasts/ recess meals and lunch on all 5 weekdays. They are strongly encouraged to make use of this arrangement to</p>

	ensure they have proper diet in school. We would like to urge parents/guardians to remind your child/wards who are under the MOE/FAS scheme to bring their MOE Concession Cards to redeem the breakfasts/recess meals and lunches at the school canteen on every school day.

Curricular innovation

Making Science Thinking Visible for P3 and P4 with the help of ICT	Similar to our efforts in 2016, we make Science learning fun by providing experiential learning and infusion of ICT in our lessons. Our pupils are encouraged to construct deeper understanding of Science concepts through making good observations, asking good questions and sharing their thinking aloud. We are working on this curriculum innovation with a team from the National Institute of Education.
Improving Confidence and Achievement in Numeracy (ICAN) Project	The ICAN Project aims to raise the confidence and improve Mathematics achievement of low progress learners through the ICAN intervention framework. Teachers involved in the project adopt the ICAN principles in their lesson planning and intervention strategies with the aim of helping the pupils to learn better, experience the joy of learning Mathematics, continue to persevere in their learning and believe that they can do better.
P3 Mobile Learning Trail at the Zoo	This trail harnessed the affordances of wireless mobile technologies and engaged our pupils as self-directed and collaborative learners. Our pupils were able to apply what they have learnt during their Science lessons on the characteristics of animals through guiding questions on their mobile devices and this helped to strengthen their observation, thinking and collaborative skills.
Primary 4 Mathematics Games Day	As part of our drive to bring about the joy of learning in Mathematics and to enhance our pupils' grasp of mathematical concepts and skills, a Mathematics Games Day was organised on 6 March 2017. We aimed to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> •develop pupils' positive attitude towards Mathematics •explore various applications of Mathematics in game play • promote collaborative learning through fun and challenging activities The pupils had great fun applying the mathematical concepts at the various game stations.

Curricular Enrichment

EL Enrichment Programmes for P3 to P6	<p>In our effort to promote the joy of learning the English Language, we organised special EL Enrichment Programmes for all P3 to P6 pupils in Term 1. A total of 8 sessions were conducted for each of the following programmes:</p> <p>P3 – Readers’ Theatre P4 – Storytelling P5 – Using Drama as a Springboard to Writing P6 – Literature Alive! (Short Story)</p> <p>Our aim was to help pupils develop good language skills through fun and engaging activities.</p>
Promotion of Reading at ZPS	<p>Friday is a day that we celebrate reading at Zhonghua Primary! To cultivate a love for reading in our pupils, we have planned for the following outreach programmes with the hope that our pupils would be motivated to start, develop an interest in, or get excited about reading:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1) Mobile Library – Every Friday during recess.2) Sharing the Joy of Reading @ ZPS – Every week, an English Language teacher would share an activity to promote the joy of reading. In Term 1, the teachers shared poems, classics, books written by Adeline Yen Mah and Minfong Ho, information on authors like Roald Dahl and Charles Dickens as well as “local” books written by our very own ZPS pupils. Pupils were also given information on where they can read free books online and were encouraged to borrow E-books from the National Library Board (NLB).
P4 LJ to Gardens by the Bay	<p>This LJ aims to create more awareness among our pupils on the importance of protecting our natural environment. Our pupils learnt to recognise that plant parts have unique functions, understood why some plants develop special features and also learned the differences between flowering and non-flowering plants. Most importantly, they learnt how to appreciate the diversity of plants and importance of plants in our environment.</p>

P2 Outdoor Learning Experience to Gardens By The Bay Date: 28/02/17 (Tuesday)	This activity aimed to allow our P2 pupils to learn and practice basic orienteering skills as well as strengthen bonds within the class. The activity concept was similar to an amazing race where classes had to travel to stations located at Gardens by the Bay and complete the given task. Students were expected to collaborate to complete the tasks given before they could move on to their next location. Stations featured team building games, environmental awareness activities, obstacle course challenge and aquatic experience.

Pupil Management and Pupil Leadership

Highlight of Important School Rules	The school has established rules to inculcate good habits, values and discipline in our pupils. The detailed school rules and regulations can be found in the Pupil's Diary. Please ensure that your child/ward adheres to the school rules highlighted below:
Leaving School During Lunch Break	For safety reasons, pupils must not leave the school premises after school curriculum hours while waiting for the start of the afternoon activity such as remedial and enrichment classes or CCA. Parents/guardians who wish to provide home-cooked food to their children/wards are strongly encouraged to hand over the food to their children/wards at the side gate (Beside security guard post). Should pupils be required to return home during the lunch break, parents/guardians are required seek permission from the school in writing. This is to ensure all pupils are accounted for and are safe.
Bringing of Relevant Materials for Learning	Pupils are expected to bring only the relevant materials such as textbooks and worksheets as required by the teachers for learning in school. Personal belongings which are not required for learning should not be brought to school. These include card games, toys, pets and electronic devices such as mobile phones, cameras, MP3 players and handheld games. This prevents distraction from school activities and minimise loss/misplacement of such items.
Wrongful Use of Social Media	We aim to build our pupils to be responsible digital learners and advocates that they practise the following three Cyber Wellness principles: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Respect self and others - Be safe and responsible - Be a positive peer influence. Pupils are strongly encouraged to respect the privacy of others and be courteous online. They are not allowed to record photos, videos, audios, etc. within the school or during learning journeys or upload media content portraying any aspect of the school on to social media except when authorised by staff member as a part of curriculum or special projects.

<p>Chinese New Year Celebrations</p>	<p>In January, the school had an enjoyable Chinese New Year Celebration as we sent off the year of Monkey and welcomed the year of Rooster. 26th of January: CNY-related recess activities such as mandarin orange-making, lantern-making, calligraphy, origami and also photo booth. 27th January: All pupils were involved in making greeting cards for their loved ones. Thereafter, we kicked off the CNY concert, starting with a fun quiz session on Chinese New year customs and traditions and followed by a hilarious skit by the “Monkey God” & Rooster. The lion dance performance was next, followed by the blessings from the “God of Wealth” as he gave away sweets to our pupils as a symbolic gesture of bestowing good luck. Our CCA Chinese Dance members also performed before the concert ended with the whole school joining in in the sing-along-session led by our very own talented Choir members. <p>TDD Commemoration 2017</p>	<p>On Wed 15 Feb 2017, the school commemorated Total Defence Day. Our pupils watched a skit during assembly on SG Secure performed by our very own teachers. Pupils were told to play a part in defending Singapore through these three tag lines; Stay Alert, Stay United and Stay Strong. Lessons on Total Defence were also conducted during Character & Citizenship Education (CCE) and Form Teacher Guidance Period (FTGP) period. In addition, our school collaborated with Serangoon Neighbourhood Police Centre to allow pupils to experience the life of a police officer.</p>
<p>Keep Singapore Clean Movement and Classroom Cleanliness</p>	<p>In support of the Keep Singapore Clean Movement, daily classroom cleaning became routine since January 2016. This is another platform for our pupils to practise our school values – Responsibility & Care. All classes came up with their own duty roster. Pupils were also told that cleaning of classrooms can be carried at any time of the school day. The school is also conducting the ‘Cleanest Classroom Award’ on a monthly basis.</p>

P4 Road safety Park Traffic Games 2017	Our Primary 4 pupils visited the Road Safety Park at East Coast Park to learn more about road safety in a simulated environment on Fri 10 Feb 2017. They were taught about road safety precautions they should take and the importance of obeying traffic rules. The pupils were given an opportunity to play the roles of a road marshal, cyclist, driver or a pedestrian. Our pupils became more aware about road safety and how they can play a part by practicing the correct road safety rules.
P4 Values-In-Action (VIA) – Fun Hour @ St Luke’s Eldercare (Serangoon)	In Term 1, the Primary 4 pupils visited our community partner – St Luke’s Eldercare (Serangoon). It is a yearly affair for our pupils to connect to the elderly through meaningful and fun activities, whilst living out our school values (Care, Respect and Harmony). Together, the pupils and teachers planned activities with the aim of engaging the elderly, and also brought along some essential items donated by the school.
