Levels	Approximate Daily Time Norms	Suggested Weekly Time Norms
P5 & P6	1.5 - 2.0 hr	9 – 13 hr

- Homework can come in different modes. Pupils should clarify and understand the expectations of the tasks assigned.
- Pupils are expected to record homework tasks in the Pupil's Diary and refer to them at home as a reminder to complete all their homework.
- Homework must be submitted on time.
- Inform the teacher if they encounter difficulty in completing the homework tasks on time.
- Take pride in their homework and complete homework assignments to the best of their ability.
- Establish a homework routine that is free from distractions.

Direct School Admission

Primary 6 (P6) students can seek admission to certain secondary schools based on their talent in sports, Co-Curricular Activities (CCAs) and specific academic areas.

Apply DSA-Sec based on a wide-range of talents, including:

- Sports and games
- Visual, literary and performing arts
- Debate and public speaking
- Science, mathematics and engineering
- Languages and humanities
- Uniformed groups
- Leadership

	DSA TIMELINE
January - May	Explore school choices Schools offer different talent areas, and each has its own selection process and schedule. Visit the schools' websites for more information. They generally update the information by late April
	Apply Once you have explored and shortlisted the schools, submit your child's application online through the DSA-Sec Portal.
September	Attend interviews or auditions Different schools have different selection processes. If shortlisted, your child will have to attend interviews, auditions or trials conducted by DSA schools. Selected students will receive DSA-Sec offers directly from schools.
October	Select preferred schools Choose up to 3 school choices in order of preference using the DSA-Sec Portal.
November	Receive school allocation results Receive school allocation along with PSLE results.

PARENTS AS MOTIVATOR

1. Attitude

Help your child to adopt the right attitude.

2. Monitoring

Ensure your child follows the class routine (promptness in preparation, homework, revision).

3. Reading

Encourage your child to read (books, magazines, papers), watch and listen to the news daily.

4. Speaking

Ensure your child gets as much support in his/her learning as possible (at least one adult: parent/ sibling/ grandparent to speak to the child in his/her MT and help him/her at home).
